Show Rules and Regulations

1. Disclaimer of Liability

Neither the Society nor any of its officers or servants will be responsible for anything that may happen to exhibitors, their servants or any other person, or their respective property or animals, or to any exhibit at the show, and it shall be considered a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Society blameless and that he/she shall be considered to indemnify the Society against any legal proceedings, claims or demands in respect thereof. Exhibitors acknowledge that they are taking part in a risk sport and agreed to having achieved a level of competency. In addition, they agree that they understand it is their responsibility to insure their property, animals and livestock (this includes infected animals)whilst on the Showground and hold full public liability insurance.

All competitors must have current public liability/third-party insurance cover. Please ensure you carry relevant documents with you as Stewards may require to see evidence.

- 2. Dogs must be on a short lead at all times whilst on the Showground..
- 3. To be eligible to make entries at Members rates an exhibitor must have paid their annual subscription by 1st April of the current year.
- 4. The Society will not be responsible for any error in the schedule or programme or for any entry being made in the wrong class.
- 5. In all classes the Society reserves the right to accept or reject the entry of any person and also the right to withdraw any prizes awarded.
- 6. The Society reserve the right to cancel or amalgamate a class if, in their opinion, there are insufficient entries.
- 7. No refunds will be made but substitution will be allowed in the horse classes by an animal belonging to the same owner. The Secretary must be notified not less than one hour before the class is due to commence.
- 8. Prizemoney will not be awarded if, in the opinion of the judges, there is insufficient merit.
- 9. A judge's decision shall be final. Any competitor intending to object must notify the Secretary in writing, together with a deposit of £50, returnable if the objection is upheld.
- 11. All cups must be returned to the Society by 1st July of the year following the award.
- 12. Valid passports must be held for all equines competing at the Show. Passports and vaccination records must be available for inspection and produced on request.
- 13. Any horse or pony competing at the Show will be liable to dope testing.
- 14. Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday in all ridden classes.
- 15. Correct riding attire must be worn and correctly secured. British Standard skull caps/riding hats to PA0152011 with BSI kitemark, VG1 with BSI kitemark, Snell 2016 onwards with the official Snell label, ASTM-F11632004a onwards with SEI mark, AS/NXS 3838, 2006 onwards must be worn at all times when mounted and by handlers aged 14 years and under in In Hand classes. Riders in BSPS classes will be required to comply with the 2024 BSPS Rulebook
- 16. Personal Data: All exhibitors will need to provide the Breed Societies with certain personal information relating to you. Your privacy is extremely important, for further information on how the Societies will use that personal information please refer to the relevant Breed Society websites.
- 17. The Alresford and District Agricultural Society recommends that all horses are vaccinated against Equine Flu.

Trophies cannot be collected before 1.00pm except in exceptional circumstances.

Open to members and non-members 15 yrs and over eligible under Rising Star Amateur Rules. Please note Rising Star Amateur Rules 2024 are separate to BSHA Amateur Rules. Please see the full list of Rising Star rules in the Rising Star section available on the BSHA website.

www.britishshowhorse.org. If in any doubt regarding your Rising Star Amateur Status, please contact the BSHA Office directly to have your status confirmed.

A results points table will run for all qualifying classes and a 'wild card' will be awarded to those unqualified with the highest points in each section following the final qualifier.

JMB certificates will not be required to compete in these classes.

The judge will NOT ride exhibits in these classes.

CLASS 1 Rising Star Racehorse to Show Horse: Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cm. Open to Thoroughbred and Arab horses

retired from race training. The highest unqualified horse placed in the top five will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Racehorse to Show Horse
Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. This class is open to competitors who we

In addition two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for The Rising Star Associate finals at the BSHA National Championships Show in September.

158cms). Capable of carrying up to 79.5kgs (12 stone 7lbs). The highest unqualified horse placed in the top five will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star

Small/Lightweight Hunter Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. In addition, the two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for The Rising Star Associate finals at the BSHA National Championships Show in September.

The Walden Salver PCC to the winner.

The HH Supporters Club PCC for the highest placed local hunter, horse/rider living within a radius of 12 miles of the showground. Those eligible to wear **WHITE** armbands – see map on page 15

Rising Type of Ridden Hunter Type. Middleweight/Heavyweight Hunter: Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 158cms. Capable of carrying over 89kgs (14 stone). The highest unqualified horse placed in the top five will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Middleweight/Heavyweight Hunter Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. In addition, the two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for The Rising Star Associate finals at the BSHA National Championships Show in September

The Parsons PCC to the winner.

The South Down Bloodhounds PCC to the highest placed local hunter, horse/rider living within a radius of 12 miles of the showground. Those eligible to wear WHITE armbands – see map on page 15

CLASS 4 Rising Star of Working Hunter type: Open to Hunters, Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over exceeding 148cm. The highest placed unqualified horse in the top five will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Working Hunter Type Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. Any horse which is registered / previously registered as a Grade A showjumper, Advanced Eventer, or above as at 1st January of the current year, is not eligible.

Height of fences: minimum 3'0", maximum 3'3", maximum spread 3'3". Please note the height of the fences may be raised

at the final at the discretion of the Course builder/ BSHA Representative.

The Nita Garry PCC to the winner.

The Catherston Thunderstorm PCC to the highest placed hunter 158cm or under. Those eligible to wear **RED** armbands - see map on page 15.

HUNTER CHAMPIONSHIP. 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 2 - 4.

The John Gray PCC to the winner.

- **BEST SHOD.** A competition sponsored by the Worshipful Company of Farriers, for the best shod horse in the hunter section, classes 2, 3 & 4. The judge will examine each horse before or during the line-up for preliminary judging, taking into consideration the following:
 - a) condition of the feet
 - b) the making (or preparation) of the shoes
 - c) the Nailing and position of the clips

Normal shoes and showing plates are equally acceptable, providing, they are suitable for the horse.

The Worshipful Company of Farriers will award:

- A rosette and an inscribed card to the winner of each class
- A brass plague to the overall winner
- A brass plaque to the Registered Farrier for its feet and shoeing

CLASS 5 Rising Star Working Show Horse: Open ONLY to Hacks, Cobs, Maxi Cobs and Riding Horses, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over exceeding 148cm. The highest placed unqualified horse in the top five will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Working Show Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in

December. Any horse which is Grade B showjumper, Intermediate Eventer, or above as at 1st January of the current year, is not eligible.

Height of fences: minimum 2'6", maximum

2'9", maximum spread 2'9".

Please note the height of the fences may be raised at the final at the discretion of the Course builder/ BSHA Representative.

CLASS 6
Rising Star Ladies Show Horse: Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cms, suitable to carry a side saddle, to be ridden by a lady. Open to all Hacks, Cobs, Riding Horses and Hunters. The highest placed unqualified horse in the top five will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Ladies Show Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December.

The Begg PCC awarded to the winner

Side Saddle Concours D'Elegance Costume Class. The sole criterion for this class is the elegance of the picture presented by horse/pony and rider, and the way of going of the horse/pony. Safe tack must be used. Detailed inspection of the rider's period costume is not required. Fancy dress is not permitted. Competitors are required to walk, trot and canter. No individual show is required, but the judge may ask a small group of 3 or 4 riders to give a short display. Competitors are requested to provide details of their costume for the Commentator.

Maxi Cob: Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 155cms - to be judged as Cobs. Judges must pay particular attention to type (i.e. short legged animals of COB type). To be shown hogged. The highest placed unqualified horse in the top five winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS

BSHA Rising Star Maxi Cob Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. In addition, the two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for The Rising Star Associate finals at the BSHA National Championships Show in September

CLASS 103 Rising Star of Riding Horse type

Small/Large: Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms and not exceeding 158cms for Small section, exceeding 158cms for Large Section. The highest placed unqualified in the top five in each section (Small and Large) will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Supreme Riding Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. As the class is amalgamated each highest unqualified horse of each section will qualify. In addition, the two highest placed unqualified horses regardless of section, will qualify for The Rising Star Associate finals at the BSHA National Championship Show in September

NPS/Corscaron Horse Essentials Home Produced Ridden Championship Qualifier— wear white arm bands. NPS/Fina Cork Saddles Young Rider Championship Qualifier— for rider up to 25 years of age

M&M RIDDEN CHAMPIONSHIP 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 205 and 206. **The Poulton PCC** to the winner.

The NPS/Nipna Dales Pony Stud Ridden Silver Medal Rosette is offered by the NPS for the best registered pony owned by a BPS qualifying or Life Member in the M&M ridden section excluding Leading Rein & First Ridden. Membership cards MUST BE presented in the ring to receive the medal and/or the qualification.

CLASS 206 BSPS HERITAGE LEAD REIN WORKING SPORTS PONY

Mare or gelding 4 yrs old and over. Mountain and Moorland registered ponies not exceeding 128cms. Ridden by a child to have attained their 5th birthday on the 1st January in the current year and not to attain their 10th birthday in the current year. Any suitable snaffle bridle. The winner qualifies for the LIHS. In Lead Rein WSP classes the Judges will be looking for a pony suitable for a child to begin their future in Working Sports Pony classes. Ponies will be shown unplaited and to their breed standard.

Marks: Manners & Style whilst performing the test (including jumping) 60 Marks Type, Movement and Way of Going 20 Marks Presentation and Suitability of pony for the rider 20 marks TOTAL 100 MARKS Criteria The Leader must be 16 years old or over and may only lead one pony in a class. The rein MUST go directly from the bit to the rider's hand, with no extra aids or attachments to or on the saddle. Handles on saddles are permitted but the reins must not be attached to the handle or to the saddle. The Lead Rein must be affixed to the noseband on which it must remain while the pony is in the ring. Whilst in the ring ponies must always be led by the leader. Method of Judging Ponies will enter the ring at the walk, they may be trotted altogether at the Judges' discretion. They will be pulled into line in any order and asked to perform an individual test around obstacles including jumping a maximum of three small upright fences not exceeding 30cms. No spread fences. Water will not be included. Ponies will not be asked to walk on artificial material e.g. plastic sheeting during the test. Riders will not be asked to dismount. Judges will penalise refusals, knockdowns or taking the wrong course. A stride or two of canter over the fences will not be penalised. There will be NO conformation marks. Ponies

must be shown unplaited and in accordance with Breed Standards.

CLASS 212

BEST HUNTING PONY. Mare or gelding, 4years old and over, not exceeding 153cms. Riders 16years and under. Brief individual show to incorporate a small fence. **The Skeggs PCC** awarded to the winner.

BSPS LIHS Qualifying classes.

MEMBERSHIP Open to members and non-members for the qualifying classes but will need to join within seven days of qualifying to enter the Final or the qualification will pass down the line. The winning pony in each class will qualify, qualification will go no lower than 3rd place. Horses/ponies do not need to have a JMB height certificate to compete in these classes. The BSPS can request any animal to be measured at their discretion. Ponies can be shown in any suitable bridles except Bitless bridles and running gags which are not permitted in any classes. In the Coloured Classes the pony must be registered with either the British Skewbald and Piebald Association or Coloured Horse and Pony Society. Riders and Owners must join the BSPS within seven days of qualifying to compete in the Final. **SHOW AND JUDGING RULES** All BSPS Classes will be judged under the BSPS Rules and the classification for the class. The BSPS Rulebook can be downloaded from the website www.bsps.com Judges may only

judge one qualifying round in each class. Any BSPS Judge can judge the Performance Classes and the BSPS Heritage Lead Rein Sports Pony Class but must be on the WHP Panel to judge the Cradle and Nursery Stakes. Judges must take account of the suitability of the bridle for the type of pony when judging the class. Judges will be asked to provide a profile of their experience and equestrian history for use by the commentator. Judges may be expected to comment on their placings and result with the Commentator. At County Shows this is to inform the competitor and the audience and enhance education for showing and the classes being judged. The Cradle and Nursery Stakes height of fences will be Open Height in the BSPS Rule Book. All classes will be marked, in the event of a tie the performance marks take preference.

Foals are not eligible to qualify.

The M&M In Hand Championship. 1^{st} and 2^{nd} prizewinners from classes 307 to 312. **The Egerton PCC** to the winner.

SILVER MEDAL ROSETTE CHAMPIONSHIPS. These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette, but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships. Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show in August 2025.

NPS/BLACKERTOR & SHARPTOR STUDS M&M In Hand Silver Medal Rosette Championship (SM-MMIH) A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by the National Pony Society for the best registered pony owned by an NPS Qualifying or Life member in the M&M In Hand section. Membership cards must be presented in the ring to receive the medal and/or the qualification. NPS M&M Breed Champions. A pony may only qualify for the Silver Medal Final once in a season. NPS M&M Breed Champion Prelim Rounds Qualifier for the Great British In Hand Show 2025 Oakridge Arena.

NPS Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in any of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register; the GSB; the AHSB; the AASB or registered in the main body of their respective M&M Stud Book. Part breds are not eligible unless over stamped into one of the British

Riding Pony studbook sections. or the Ridden Register. Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from August 2025. The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified. NPS/Corscaron Horse Essentials Home Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home-Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show. The Owner's Membership cards MUST be produced in the ring when requested or the qualification will be forfeit.

PARA CLASSES – Rosettes to all. Prizes in kind. For riders/leaders who have been diagnosed with a Permanent impairment.
